The Board of Aldermen met in regular session at 6:00 P.M.

- Aldermen Present: Connie Painter, Marvin Viloria, Jason Osbourne, Jeremy Moss, John Long and Gary Thompson
- Others Present: Rich Enochs, Kevin O'Bryan, Chris Ellison, Terry Gibbs, Phillip Krug, Jackie Pangborn and Ryan Cowden

Mayor Minor called the meeting to order.

Mayor Minor asked everyone to stand and recite the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Consent Agenda was reviewed and approved on a motion by Alderman Moss; a second by Alderman Painter, with all in favor.

Mayor Minor opened the floor for open forum. No one asked to speak.

Mayor Minor said that the Missouri Municipal League will be hosting MML Day in January at the Capital. If anyone wants to go they must RSVP by January 2, 2018.

The Highway 36 Transportation Development District met recently and decided to divide all unused sales tax collections for the Highway 36 project equally among the four participating counties. Monroe County has agreed to divide its share on a per capita basis among the county and the cities within the county. Monroe City could end up with \$40,000 to \$50,000 of additional sales tax money. The termination of the Highway 36 Transportation Development District must be made by a vote of the people. This measure will be on the ballot in April 2018.

Alderman Thompson presented the Public Works report to the Board of Aldermen. Kevin O'Bryan has finished hauling dirt from the Industrial Park. The new street sweeper has been delivered and has been put into service. It is working satisfactorily. The company hired to cut the brush away from the 69 KVA line has completed the job. The Electric Department can now safely remove the remaining brush. The Gas Water Sewer Department had to repair a 10" water main at the junction of Highways 24 & 36 last Saturday night.

Jackie Pangborn presented the Director of Administration's report to the Board of Aldermen:

Lakeside Casting Solutions has submitted an application for utility incentive credit program benefit. They have created 14 new full time jobs with benefits during 2017. According to City policy they will receive \$300.00 for each of these jobs created as long as these jobs last at least one year. Their total credits amounts to \$4,200.00. Alderman Painter motioned to grant Lakeside Casting Solutions a \$4,200.00 credit on their January 31, 2018 utility for granting 14 new jobs; Alderman Long seconded it, with all in favor.

- She presented an invoice from Missouri Association of Natural Gas Operators (MANGO). They provide the required natural gas public awareness program for the City. The invoice amount is \$575.00 and covers 2018. She asked for authorization to pay this bill. Alderman Thompson motioned to approve payment of this invoice; Alderman Painter seconded it, with all in favor.
- Luck Humphreys has requested that the City send them a letter of authorization to take the generating fuel at the power plant that the City has on hand for the past several years and move it to an "impairment loss" which means that we will not consider it an asset anymore. The letter would also explain that although we haven't used the engines or switchgear for a while, we need to keep those as assets since we are in the process of utilizing them in the future. Jackie Pangborn said that Kerry Lee has asked Altorfer Machinery Company to inspect the City's Caterpillar engines to insure that they can be run. Kerry Lee plans to exercise them on a regular basis so that they can be run in an emergency. After discussion, Alderman Long motioned to authorize Jackie Pangborn to send this letter to Luck Humphreys as requested; Alderman Moss seconded it, with all in favor. Mayor Minor left the Gary Thompson, Mayor Pro Tem, presided in Mayor Minor's meeting. absence.
- Jackie Pangborn presented a letter from two citizens requesting that the City provide a skating rink for the youth.
- Authorization is needed to designate Jamie Allen as a voting member of the Municipal Gas Commission. Alderman Long motioned to appoint Jamie Allen as a voting member of the Municipal Gas Commission; Alderman Moss seconded it, with all in favor.
- She presented the City's annual agreement with Learning Opportunities to provide cleaning services for City Hall, Library, Police Station and Fire Station at an hourly rate of \$8.93 per hour. Alderman Painter motioned authorize the Mayor to sign this contract on behalf of the City; Alderman Osbourne seconded it, with all in favor.
- She presented a Municipal Gas Commission of Missouri Joint contract that all member cities are asked to approve. Attorney Wilcox said that there is no reason for the City not to enter into this contract. After discussion, Alderman Moss motioned to authorize the Mayor to enter into this contract on behalf of the City; Alderman Long seconded it, with all in favor. Jackie Pangborn presented a proposed ordinance which would authorize the Mayor to enter into a joint operating agreement with the Municipal Gas Commission of Missouri. The proposed ordinance was assigned bill # 9. The first reading of bill #9 was read and approved on a motion by Alderman Osbourne, a second by Alderman Long, with all in favor. The second reading of bill # 9 was read

and approved on a motion by Alderman Painter, a second by Alderman Osbourne, with all in favor. Alderman Painter motioned to approve the final passage of bill # 9; Alderman Moss seconded it, with a vote as follows:
